

THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT WILLIAM
of me WILLIAM FREDERIC GOODLIFFE of "Lisle House" in the County Borough of Bourne- F R E D E R I C
mouth Gentleman I herewith ascribe Glory to God for blessing me with prosperity and G O O D L I F F E

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enabling me to make bequests to my family and to charitable institutions for the extension of His Kingdom which is Righteousness and Peace I revoke all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this only to be my last will and testament I appoint my dear wife Elizabeth Hardy Goodliffe and my friends Donald William Preston and Albert Edward Francis Francis both of Bournemouth aforesaid (who and the survivors and survivor of whom are hereinafter for brevity called "my trustees") to be the EXECUTORS AND TRUSTEES of this my will and I give to each of the said Donald William Preston and Albert Edward Francis Francis the sum of one hundred pounds in recognition of his proving my will and in connection with the trusteeship hereby created I give to my dear wife the sum of five hundred pounds the amount of the insurance on my life and all my household furniture books pictures plate and plated articles carriages and horse or horses and all my jewellery and personal ornaments and consumable stores I give my leasehold dwellinghouse known as "Lisle House" -- Bournemouth (where I now reside) or if I shall sell the same in my lifetime and purchase another residence then I give such last mentioned residence unto my trustees In trust to permit my said wife to have the use and enjoyment thereof during her life she paying the ground rent (if payable) and all rates taxes insurance premiums and outgoings payable in respect thereof and performing the covenants contained in the lease (if leasehold) under which the same is held And after her decease I direct that the same shall be held In trust for my three daughters Ellen Martha Clara Isabella and Ada Margaret in equal shares as tenants in common I give the following legacies namely To my cook Louisa Tremlett one hundred and twenty five pounds To my coachman George Wells One hundred and twenty five pounds And to each of my other servants who shall have been in my service for at least one year immediately before my death a sum of three pounds for every completed year of such service I give the following annuities namely An annuity of One thousand two hundred pounds to my dear wife for her life an annuity of two hundred pounds to each of my said three daughters and to each of my three sons William Francis Frederic and John Henry for his or her life provided that my said wife shall so long live And I direct that each of the last

mentioned annuities shall cease to be payable immediately on the death of the annuitant or of my said wife whichever shall first happen I also give an annuity of thirty pounds To each of my two sisters Elizabeth Ellen Ward and Mary Jane Goodwin and to each of my two brothers Henry Arnold Goodliffe and Alfred Pitt Goodliffe and to my sister in law Mrs Sarah Adams for his or her life And I also give an annuity of thirty pounds for the joint use and benefit of my two nieces Anne Maria Reynolds and Mary Elizabeth Reynolds (daughters of my late sister Anne Maria Reynolds) during their joint lives And I direct that such annuity shall be continued for the benefit of the survivor during her life I direct that all the legacies and annuities hereinbefore given shall be paid free of legacy or other duty And I direct my trustees to accumulate the income of the residue of my real and personal estate after payment of the said annuities during the life of my said wife And I direct that such accumulations shall fall into and form part of the residue of my estate hereinafter referred to I further direct that the said several annuities shall be paid quarterly the first quarterly payment to be made at the expiration of three calendar months after my decease and I desire that so long as my wife is able to do so she shall keep the books and make out cheques for such quarterly payments subject to the examining of such books and the countersigning of such cheques by one of my other trustees I direct that from and after the decease of my wife my trustees shall stand possessed of the whole of the residue of my estate real and personal (hereinafter referred to as "the residue") Upon trust at their discretion either to set aside a sufficient portion of the capital thereof to satisfy such of the annuities hereinbefore directed to continue after the death of my said wife as shall then be payable or shall purchase either from the government or from some well established insurance office annuities of thirty pounds each in favour of such of my said sisters brothers and nieces hereinbefore mentioned as shall be then living And upon further trust to pay out of the residue the following sums videlicet The sum of ten thousand pounds to my said son William Francis Goodliffe if then living The sum of ten thousand pounds to my son Frederic Goodliffe if then living the sum of five thousand pounds to my son John Henry Goodliffe if then living and in case he shall be then living and shall have a child I direct that the said sum of five thousand pounds shall be increased to eight thousand pounds The sum of eight thousand pounds to my daughter Ellen Martha Goodliffe if then living The sum of eight thousand pounds to my daughter Clara Isabella Goodliffe if then living and the sum of eight thousand pounds to my daughter Ada Margaret Goodliffe if then living And I hereby declare that in case either of my said sons William Francis and Frederic shall die in the lifetime of my said wife leaving a child or children him surviving I direct my trustees to stand possessed of the said sum of

ten thousand pounds so bequeathed to each of them as aforesaid Upon trust to pay thereout to the widow of such son (if then living) the sum of one thousand pounds and (subject thereto) to pay and divide the said sum of ten thousand pounds (or nine thousand pounds as the case may be) unto and amongst all the children of such son who shall attain or shall have attained the age of twenty one years in equal shares and if there shall be but one child of such son the whole sum of ten thousand pounds or nine thousand pounds (as the case may be) shall go to such one child And I declare that in case my said son John Henry shall die in the lifetime of my said wife leaving a child or children him surviving I direct my trustees to stand possessed of the sum of five thousand pounds hereinbefore bequeathed to him as aforesaid Upon trust to pay there out to the widow of such son (if then living) the sum of one thousand pounds and subject thereto to pay and divide the said sum of five thousand pounds (or four thousand pounds as the case may be) unto and amongst all the children of my said son John Henry who shall attain the age of twenty one years in equal shares and if there shall be but one such child the whole to be in trust for that one child And in case my said son John Henry shall die in the lifetime of my said wife without leaving a child or children the said sum of five thousand pounds hereinbefore given to him will not be payable and in that case I direct my trustees to pay to the widow of my said son John Henry if living at the death of my said wife the sum of one thousand pounds I hereby plate on record my express desire that my trustees shall invest in suitable stocks mortgages or other securities each sum of eight thousand pounds hereinbefore given to each of my daughters and shall transfer such investments to them in lieu of paying them such sums in cash I also direct my trustees after the death of my said wife to pay out of the residue the following charitable legacies namely --

I direct my trustees to hold the residue after providing for or paying the annuities and legacies hereinbefore bequeathed and complying with the directions hereinbefore contained Upon trust to be paid and applied to or for the benefit of persons or institutions which I shall designate by a list to be hereafter signed by me and witnessed as a testamentary document And I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of each of the several funds societies hospitals and institutions shall be a good discharge to my trustees for payment of the said legacies And I declare that my trustees shall have full power to retain any part of my real or personal estate and investments in their hands for so long as they shall think fit unsold and unconverted although the same may not be in the nature of a trustees investment without being responsible for loss or to sell the same or any part thereof when and as they shall deem it expedient Also that as regards any freehold or leasehold properties remaining unsold my trustees shall be at liberty to let or demise the same on such terms as they shall think fit and to manage the properties and spend money in repairs and improvements according to their absolute discretion And I declare that any executor or trustee being a solicitor shall be entitled to charge and be paid all professional or other charges for any business or act done by him or his firm in connection with the trust including any act which an executor or trustee not being a solicitor could have done personally IN WITNESS whereof I have to this my last will and testament set my hand the twenty fourth day of March One thousand nine hundred and eleven -- W.F.GOODLIFFE -- Signed by the said William Frederic Goodliffe the testator as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us both present at the same time who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses -- T.K.PRESTON Solicitor Bournemouth -- W.T.TARRANT Clerk with Messrs Preston & Francis Solicitors Bournemouth.
